- S** – Subject; the theme or topic of the clause
 - V** – Verb; actions, sensations, or states of being
 - O** – Object; who or what has been affected by the verb
 - C** – Complement; an item that gives more information about another clause element
 - A** – Adverbial; information about time, manner, frequency, and location
 - Q** – Question word
